### Uniform

Tiverton High School is proud of its uniform and how our students appear, both in school and to the public. We believe this reflects positively on our school, but more importantly it ensures our students feel prepared for work and face fewer distractions in the classroom.

We also believe that through upholding our policies around behaviour, uniform and personal appearance all students are seen as equal. More details about our uniform suppliers will follow.

- Jacket: Tiverton High School jacket with logo
- Shirt: A long or short sleeved plain white shirt with collar buttoned to the neck.
- Tie: Correct year group tie see below.
- Trousers: Riveted plain black full-length school trousers.
- Shorts: Riveted plain black school shorts, worn at an appropriate and respectable length, knee length.
- Jumpers: Plain black V-neck knitted jumper or cardigan over shirt and tie (optional). With or without THS logo. This cannot be worn as an alternative to the school jacket.
- Socks: Black or white socks.
- Footwear: Plain black leather/synthetic flat shoes.

**Jewellery**: Maximum of two stud earrings. Badges issued by the school. Watches (not smart watches). A single nose stud.

**Hair & makeup:** Discreet make-up, if worn. Tattoos and body art are not permitted. Fake eyelashes are not permitted.

#### The following are not allowed:

- Trousers: Leggings, jeggings, jeans, skin-tight/stretch trousers, shiny trousers, trousers with zip adornment, cropped or ¾ length trousers.
- Shorts: Shorts that are not an appropriate or respectable length or that do not allow a reasonable range of movement.
- Jumpers: Round-necked jumpers. Hoodies (with the exception of PE hoodies worn only when taking part in PE).
- Socks: Knee-high or coloured socks.
- Footwear: Canvas/skater style shoes. No coloured logos/laces or coloured accents.



#### **PE Kit**

The compulsory items of kit you will need to order from Stitch2Print are:

- THS Hobby Polo
- A choice of THS Shorts or THS Elba Tracksuit Bottoms or THS Leggings or THS Katy Ladies Skort (only 1 of these is compulsory) or black bottoms. Further details about black bottoms are below:
- These must be black, with no mesh and no large logos.
- The gymnastics type Nike pro shorts that are short in length will not be accepted nor will those of a similar length.
- Students will be allowed to continue wearing any THS Joma navy bottoms they currently own.
- You will be able to purchase plain black bottoms from Stitch2Print without the school badge.

### Food and the refectory

We are very lucky to have fantastic catering here and we work hard to have healthy, fresh and a broad range of different food available every day. Students can buy food at school or can bring a packed lunch. We use a cashless catering system and you'll be sent information about how to set up an account later in the term. Students pay for their food with a bio-metric system.

### Clubs and enrichment opportunities

There are plenty of opportunities to get involved with activities outside of lessons here at THS. We have lots of clubs to try and join. These take place before school, break times and after school. The clubs range from sports activities, performing arts, charity clubs like INTERACT (Young Rotary) to homework clubs and even a Young Carers club and a surf club.

As you move through the school there are also enrichment activities like Ten Tors, Duke of Edinburgh Award, Carnegie Book Club and CREST, a science club.

We like to encourage students to try new clubs and involve themselves in the life of the school as much as possible. The Enrichment Timetable is published at the start of each term.
